

### Role Of Orientation Leader

Orientation Leaders (OLs) will play a vital role in the Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR). During SOAR, OLs will greet new students and their families, participate in informational sessions, conduct campus tours, and other duties to assist the staff in the Office of First Year Programs.

### Position Responsibilities

- Public relations – OLs must represent Morehead State University in the best possible manner. You will be ambassadors of MSU.
- Assist new students and families as they transition to MSU.
- Be helpful and friendly – always.
- Assist Office of First Year Programs with duties as assigned. Duties for SOAR may include assisting with check-in, greeters, supervise Camp Eagle, and conduct campus tours

### Qualifications

To be eligible for consideration, applicants must:

1. Be in good social standing with MSU.
2. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.500 or higher by the end of the Spring 2009 semester.
3. Be available for training and all SOAR events.
4. High energy level and enthusiasm.
5. Exhibit knowledge of first year student issues.
6. Exhibit leadership abilities.
7. Exhibit a commitment to Morehead State University and its mission.
8. Adhere to a strong code of ethics.
9. Exhibit strong communication skills.
10. Be able to work with a diverse group of people including students, parents, faculty, and staff.

### Length of Position

The position begins with training April 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> and will end at the close of the July 21 SOAR program.
