A) Planning Your Schedule: As you plan your philosophy schedule, keep this in mind: **PHIL 355** and **PHIL 499C** are offered only in the Fall semester, and **PHIL 356** is offered only in the Spring semester. Make sure that you will be able to take these courses during the semesters in which they are offered.

B) Double Majors and PHIL 499c: If you have a double major in philosophy and some other discipline, you may get permission not to take PHIL 499c. Please speak with your Philosophy advisor.

C) PHIL 399 Special Class: You may use as many PHIL 399s as you like toward your program requirements, provided each PHIL 399 is a different topic.

D) PHIL 476 Special Problems (Independent Study) is offered upon arrangement with a faculty member. No more than 3 hours of PHIL 476 may count toward the program requirements. Please speak with a faculty member if you are interested in doing this independent study.
