

MSU COVID-19 VACCINATION INFORMATION

Morehead State University encourages everyone to get a Covid vaccination. This is great way to protect yourself and your campus community. If you're not sure if the vaccine is right for you, please consult with your medical provider.

Covid-19 vaccinations are widely available. Locally, you can receive a Covid vaccine through St. Claire Healthcare, the Gateway Health Department, and most local pharmacies. Go to <http://vaccinefinder.org> to find out where vaccines are available.

Morehead State University, in cooperation with St. Claire Healthcare, will offer an on-campus, walk-in clinic on Thursday, August 12th and Friday, August 13th in Laughlin Gymnasium. No appointments are necessary. *Onsite parent/guardian consent is required for students under the age of 18.*

Vaccines are also available by appointment at the MSU Counseling & Health Services clinic in Allie Young Hall. Call (606) 783-2055 to schedule your appointment.

Unvaccinated students should make travel/quarantine plans prior to campus arrival. In most cases, Morehead State University will not accommodate on-campus quarantine. Students who must quarantine due to close contact exposure to Covid-19 will be expected to quarantine at home/off-campus at their own expense.

Did you know that [fully Covid-19 vaccinated individuals are not required to quarantine](#) due to exposure? Avoid missing school or work by getting your vaccination today!

* There are three (3) vaccines authorized for use in the US: The Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna vaccines both require two doses while the Johnson & Johnson vaccine uses a single dose. Individuals are considered to be fully vaccinated two weeks after their final dose.
