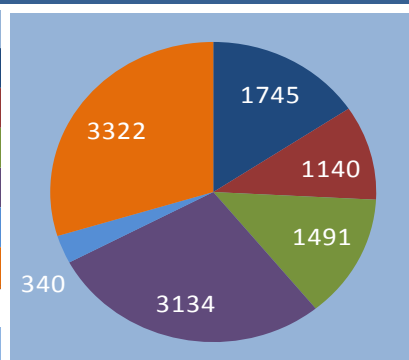

## Enrollment Quick Facts

- 529 new transfer students (including 21 Black, Non-Hispanics). 361 transferred from KCTCS.
- 6,763 enrolled from the 22-county service region.
- 2,980 enrolled from other Kentucky counties.
- 1,316 enrolled from 43 other states.
- 113 enrolled from 31 foreign countries.
- 65 Black, Non-Hispanics were among the 1,649 first-time freshmen.
- 66% First-Time Freshman retention rate from Fall 2011 to Fall 2012 (65% for under-represented minorities).
- 2,862 students in MSU residence halls and apartments.
