Our [Facilities Management](#) crews make every effort to ensure a clean, safe and healthy environment for our campus community. [MSU Counseling and Health Services](#) offers students free health services including preventative immunizations. The health clinic distributes stall notes to remind students, staff and visitors of health risks on campus and in the community. MSU has a pandemic plan and coordinates with the local hospital and emergency planning commission to plan for the worst case scenarios.

It seems each year, new health threats emerge across our nation that we must prepare for and sometimes deal with on our campus. Some of the community health concerns that can prevail on college campuses include [indoor mold](#), vectors and the diseases they spread such as [bedbugs](#), [west nile virus](#), [zika virus](#) and [lyme disease](#), and communicable viruses such as the [seasonal flu](#), [stomach flu](#), [MRSA](#) and [meningitis](#).
